Day	Prompt	Today's Color	How to Explore	Completed
1	Radiant	<u>Lemon Yellow</u>	Mix with a touch of Rose Madder to create glowing peachy sunrises. Try a radiant wash fading to white.	
2	Espresso	<u>Burnt Vmber</u>	Mix with Ultramarine Blue to create rich, deep shadows or a near-black. Try dry brushing for texture.	
3	Ripple	<u>Cobalt Turquoise</u>	Glaze over granulating neutrals to mimic light dancing on water. Try lifting ripples with a damp brush.	
4	Fade	<u>Payne's Grey</u> (diluted)	Create a value gradient from dark to near-clear. Practice a smooth wash that "fades to nothing."	
5	Lock	<u>Indigo</u>	Mix with Burnt Sienna for steel blues. Try using masking fluid or hard edges to suggest solidity.	
6	Hat	<u>Scarlet Lake</u>	Try a triad mix with Cobalt Blue and Lemon Yellow to create lively shadow tones. Use for a bold focal point.	
7	Melt	<u>Naples Yellow</u>	Mix with Cobalt Blue to make gentle greens. Let two colors melt together wet-in-wet.	
8	Tired	<u>Buff Titanium</u>	Soften any bright color by mixing with Buff. Try a desaturated palette today.	
g	Ноше	<u>Light Red</u>	Mix with Yellow Ochre for warm terracotta tones. Use in cozy interior textures or bricks.	
10	Turtle	<u>Sap Green</u>	Mix with Quinacridone Gold and Ultramarine for a full turtle-shell palette. Try dry-on-dry texture.	
11	Spicy	<u>Quin Burnt Orange</u>	Add a dot of Alizarin or Indigo to deepen into chili shades. Splash or spatter for heat!	
12	Rumble	<u>Neutral Tint</u>	Mix with any color to deepen and stormify it. Try a layered sky or thundercloud scene.	
13	Cavern	<u>Shadow Violet</u>	Use alone or with Lunar Black for a moody, granulating wash. Let it dry naturally and observe texture.	
1 4	Stretch	<u>Cobalt Blue</u>	Paint a tall or wide wash gradient. Mix with Rose for moody violets or skies.

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Day	Prompt	Today's Color	How to Explore	Completed		
15	Dusty	<u>Potters Pink</u>	Mix with Cobalt or Buff for vintage tones. Use for dry flowers, old books, or antique fabrics.			
16	Geode	<u>Amethyst Genuine</u>	Try wetting paper first, then dropping this in with a contrasting blue or green. Let it do its thing!			
17	Chair	<u>Yellow Ochre</u>	Mix with Raw Umber or Cerulean for wood and fabric tones. Try texture by lifting with a sponge.			
18	Rigid	<u>Sepia</u>	Use for ink-style lines or architectural shadows. Mix with Burnt Umber for warmth. Try hard edges.			
19	Perform	<u>Opera Pink</u>	Use with Indigo or Aureolin for show-stopping contrasts. Let the pink dominate a bold focal object.			
20	Kitchen	<u>Cerulean Blue</u>	Mix with Yellow Ochre for pale, minty greens. Think of tiles, plates, or enamel jugs.			
21	Street Food	<u>Indian Yellow</u>	Mix with Alizarin Crimson for golden reds. Use loose brushwork to suggest energy and variety.			
22	Jacket	<u>Phthalo Green</u> (BS)	Mix with Alizarin for rich darks. Try a pattern or fabric texture using negative space.			
23	Group	Mixed Greys	Mix any three primaries to create a "group grey." Let each person/element have a tint of a different hue.			
24	Avocado	<u>Olive Green</u>	Mix with Yellow Ochre or Raw Sienna for ripe variations. Try subtle glazing to show texture.			
25	Howl	<u>Indigo</u> + <u>Burnt Vmber</u>	Try dry-on-wet to create smoky or fur-like edges. Let pigment trail like an echo.			
26	Sea	<u>Prussian Blue</u>	Mix with Viridian for sea greens. Practice layering waves or foam with lifting techniques.			
27	Drift	Lavender	Try a granulating lavender like Wisteria or mix your own from Cobalt and Rose. Let it drift into white.			
28	Weave	<u>Burnt Sienna</u> + <u>Cobalt</u>	Create complex browns and greys. Use hatch marks or woven brush strokes for texture.			
29	Submerge	<u>Cobalt Green Deep</u>	Mix with Phthalo Blue or Cerulean for ocean depths. Let pigments flow into each other.			
30	Ornate	<u>Gold</u> (or Mica Gold)	Highlight with gold accents or paint a decorative border. Mix with crimson for a regal orange.			
31	Tower	<u>Davy's Grey</u>	Mix with Cerulean or Buff for a soft stone palette. Try layering angular shapes or shadows.			
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
